Welcome to our third and last newsletter of the 2024/25 Circle year. I am so excited to share more amazing content with you from across Ladies Circle and the 5 clubs.


This issue is mostly centered around looking back at the amazing journey we have had together and looking forward to what is still to come.



### What was the motivation behind LC Chingola in formation


Motivation for establishing the Chingola Ladies Circle stems from three years of experience with the Kitwe Ladies Circle #3. The increasing number of Chingola ladies joining and inquiring about membership demonstrates the positive community impact of Ladies' Circles across Zambia. 3 prominent reasons where:

(a) Building a supportive network for young women to encourage community involvement and collaboration is key in Chingola. This network will address local needs in Chingola by identifying specific challenges and opportunities, thereby customizing networking and charitable activities to effectively address local issues. It is by sharing resources, expertise and best practices that lead to efficient and impactful outcomes. This approach will promote business growth and economic development within the community.

(b) Contributing to positive change through charitable giving is key in Chingola. Well-designed charitable initiatives can address the underlying causes of poverty and inequality, initiatives such as promoting education, improving healthcare access, and advocating for policy changes.

This can be accomplished by empowering communities with resources and opportunities, enabling individuals and communities to shape their own lives and futures. Furthermore, charitable initiatives raise awareness of significant social issues and mobilize support for positive change in Chingola and beyond.

(c) Personal and professional growth, alongside networking and service, is a key aspect of this opportunity. Chingola Ladies circle in formation will provide valuable leadership and management experience, fostering the development of strong networks and relationships through interactions with diverse stakeholders. It also offers opportunities for skills enhancement in fundraising, marketing, communication, and event management. Finally, the personal fulfillment derived from positively impacting the lives of others and contributing to community betterment is deeply rewarding.





## Tell us about your members.

We currently have 19 members in LC Chingola in formation made up of 6 existing circlers and 13 active prospective members. An interim council is in place with a mix of current and prospective members.



## Who is your honorary member and any words from her?

Our Honorary Member is Tangent Member and Past Ladies Circle Zambia National Projects Convenor and Past Kitwe Ladies Circle No.3 Chairperson Dr. Lilias Masiba.

She had this to say about becoming our honorary member:

*"Ladies Circle Zambia has attempted to establish a Circle in Chingola for a while now. When I joined Circle in 2005, some ladies had been identified in Chingola who were actively trying to form a Circle but didn't succeed to charter one. A second attempt was made in 2017 with some ladies being inducted into Kitwe Ladies Circle No 3, but did not succeed to establish one in Chingola. It is so exciting to see the achievements made so far and I am privileged to be asked to be the Honorary Member. I accepted this position because it is an honor to be part of such a success story. To be chosen to play such an important role is a rare blessing and I do not take the request for granted".*



## What is your project focus for the year.

Our project for 2024-2025 will be a donation of Dignity Kits and an Empowerment workshop centered on period poverty, career development, early child marriages and teenage pregnancies. Our beneficiary is Liankole day and high school, which is located in Ipfafu farming community, 10 km from the CBD of Chingola. The area is commonly known for early child marriages and girls not being supported during the menstruation periods. After a project visitation conducted on 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2025, the school advised that it has now been upgraded to a day and high school. The school currently has approximately 200 adolescent girls from grades 4 to 12 and the workshop targeted 112 children from grades 7 to 12 accordingly.

In phase 1, Chingola ladies circle in formation successfully held their project donation and empowerment workshop on 8<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 at Luankole Day and high school. The workshop was graced by our honorary member Dr. Liliias Masiba and Godparent Chairperson Agatha Muimui, Kitwe Ladies Circle #3 members and Chingola round table #7. The Chingola Ladies' Circle shared lunch with the participants and provided dignity kits to the learners. The dignity kits included sewing kits, a Chitenge, disposable pads, a pair of socks, a pant and a 192 paged note book.

In Phase 2, Chingola Ladies Circle in formation will donate re-usable Pads to Liankole Day School on 16<sup>th</sup> May, 2025.

## Ladies Circle Zambia Board Positions.

Every year in May, Ladies Circle Zambia heads to its Annual General Meeting where it elects a Vice President, National Secretary, National Treasurer, National Stores Convenor and National Projects Convenor. Nominations for open positions should be filed no later than 1<sup>st</sup> May.

An aspiring candidate should have served as Chairperson of their own circle and should be an active member of their circle. For one to stand as Vice President, there is an additional requirement to have served as a national board member for one to qualify.

Board Positions are open to all qualifying candidates, regardless of the full member circle you belong to. As long as you place value on leadership development, skills enhancement, personal fulfilment and networking, then you are encouraged to rise up and put your name forward to help shape the future of our association. Remember that there are many Past Presidents who are readily available to support and guide you, you are never doing it alone. After all, Leadership is about getting things done, together.


